Statement of Faith

All Scripture is self-attesting and being Truth, requires our unreserved submission in all areas of life. The infallible Word of God, the Old and New Testament, is uniquely and fully inspired by the Holy Spirit and is the supreme and final authority on all matters. (See 2 Peter 1:20-21; 2 Timothy 3:16)

We believe in one God the sovereign Creator and Sustainer of all things, infinitely perfect and externally existing in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. (See 1 John 5:7-8)

Jesus Christ, the Son, became flesh through His miraculous conception by the Holy Spirit and His virgin birth. He who is true God became true man united in one Person forever. He died on the cross, a sacrifice for our sins, was buried and resurrected in order to redeem mankind from sin and reunite them through His blood in a relationship with God, the Father. God "desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and one Mediator between God and men, the Man Christ Jesus." He now is in heaven and will one day return to take us to be with Him.

Salvation is the recognition of our sinful condition, which separates us from God, the acceptance of Jesus Christ's work on the cross, and asking Him to cleanse us from sin. It is not by works of righteousness that we have done, but according to His mercy and grace that we are saved. The Holy Spirit instructs and guides us into all truth, and seals us for the day of redemption.

We believe God's plan for human sexuality is expressed in a monogamous exclusive marriage between one genetic man and one genetic woman, joined together by God in a lifelong commitment of mutual fidelity and love. (Gen. 2:21-25; 1:27; Matt. 19:56; Mark 10:6 – 9; 1 Cor. 6:9; I Cor. 7:2; Eph. 5:22-33; Romans 1:24–32)

The true Church is composed of all persons who through saving faith in Jesus Christ and the sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit are united together in the body of Christ. (See Ephesians 4:1-6)
